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I don't remember if I have mentioned my dialysis condition, but am presently undergoing nightly treatments for this. Having recently undergone kidney failure, it has become a life-threatening condition.

Between Medicare, the VA, and my own medical insurance, I am currently having peritoneal (abdominal) dialysis performed nightly in my own home. This ability to take care of the urea in one's body, without normal kidney functions, is only a 30 year medical discovery. Before these advances in medicine, it would be treatable only by transplant with a donor kidney.

The first realization of dialysis possibility came about with the development of regular, three times- weekly blood exchanges under hospital conditions. With this ability for removing urea from the human body, patients had to visit a hospital three times weekly for a four to six hour visit, having their blood circulated through a machine for this purpose. Normally treatments are given during daylight hours, taking precious time from a patients' weekly activity. This is known as hemodialysis, and is both expensive as well as time-consuming.

My peritoneal form is less expensive, done in the convenience of my own home, seven nights a week. A surgical step is first performed to attach a small plastic tube (catheter) permanently into my abdomen, with it protruding near my navel. Here it is passed through the skin to the outside of the body, taped to the outer skin and given a removable plastic cap.

When I go to bed at night, my wife simply sterilizes her hands and hooks me up to a small, bedside machine via the catheter. Another catheter runs from the dialyzer and is attached for drainage to the nearby toilet. She pushes the "on" button then the system empties and fills my abdomen with dialysis fluid, three or four times – while I sleep. A bag of dialysis fluid rests atop the machine, also hooked up by a catheter, providing the liquid to fill and rinse my abdominal cavity for the several times needed during the night. Most nights, Sue and I sleep through the treatment. All of this medical cost is handled by Medicare and my medical insurance. I am eligible for kidney transplants, but at age 81 am not going to even try this route. My bedroom? It looks like hospital central! *Chaplain Moore*
